



## Proposed ACRA Amendment

1. Create a legislative task force that provides an interim report to the legislature by December 31, 2021, to recommend draft legislation that accomplishes the following:
  - a. Reduce excessive alcohol use by 15% by utilizing alcohol tax and pricing mechanisms.
  - b. Fully fund the Alcohol and Drug Policy Commission (ADPC) Strategic Plan to reduce Oregon's substance use disorder (SUD) rate from 9.45% to 6.8% and increase Oregon's recovery rate from 9.1% to 11.4% within two years by utilizing tax and pricing mechanisms.
  - c. Apply racial equity and socio-economic lens to both components.
2. The task force will partner with a consortium of one or more consulting firms with economic and health equity expertise to draft the legislation.
3. This task force must be organized within the House Behavioral Health Committee and the Chair of the House Behavioral Health Committee must appoint the non-legislative members of the task force.
4. The task force must include the following and will be chosen by the Speaker of the House and the Senate President:
  - a. Two legislators (2 House Members appointed by the Speaker and 2 Senators appointed by the Senate President).
  - b. Two tribal representatives
  - c. One representative of addiction treatment providers
  - d. One person with public health expertise
  - e. One representative from an addiction recovery organization
  - f. The OHA Behavioral health director or a representative to attend on their behalf
  - g. The executive director of the Alcohol and Drug Policy Commission or a representative to attend on their behalf
  - h. The public health liaison from the Oregon Liquor Control Commission or a representative to attend on their behalf
  - i. One representative from the League of Oregon Cities

- j. One representative from the Association of Oregon Counties
- k. One representative from the CCO's
- l. One representative from the alcohol distributors sector
- m. One representative from the Oregon alcohol manufacturers sector
- n. One representative from on-premise alcohol licensee holders
- o. One representative from off-premise alcohol licensee holders
- p. Four representatives from culturally specific organizations
