




HOW MANY YEARS HAVE YOU BEEN IN RECOVERY?






WHICH BEST DESCRIBES YOUR RECOVERY?







Yes, motivated by courts No, not motivated by courts




DID YOU VOTE FOR BALLOT MEASURE 110?






SINCE MEASURE 110 PASSED DO YOU THINK DRUG USE HAS INCREASED OR DECREASED IN OREGON?











75.2% of BIPOC individuals in recovery, and 64.1% of LGBTQ individuals in recovery believe that BM110 should be amended or repealed.

Among those recovering individuals who identified court as a motivating factor in their personal recovery, 88.7% believe BM110 should be either amended or repealed.

Among those in recovery from addiction who previously voted in favor of BM110, 71% now believe it should be amended or repealed.
